Lesson plan schedule

What will exactly happen in the framework of this project?

Planned schedule/ milestones:

Lesson Plan: The Life of Lisa Pinhas

Grade Level: 9th Grade

Duration: 90 minutes

Lesson Objectives:

- Learn about the Jewish community in Thessaloniki during the Holocaust
- Understand the importance of resilience and hope
- Explore personal storytelling as a method of historical learning
- Develop creative expression through meaningful messaging

Lesson Steps:

1. Introduction (10 minutes)

- Begin with a brief historical context of the Jewish community in Thessaloniki
- Explain the significance of Thessaloniki as a major Jewish cultural center before World War II
- Introduce Lisa Pinhas and her background as a Jewish-Greek Holocaust survivor
